FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AS OF FEBRUARY 28, 2015 KELLY ALLEN, CONTROLLER

For the two months ending February 28, 2015, the POA had an operating profit (before depreciation) of \$352,906 and a net income (after depreciation) of \$227,391, which was \$238,244 better than budget. For the month ending February 28, 2015, the POA had an operating profit of \$125,468 and a net income of \$62,711, which was \$75,211 better than budget. Gross profit (revenue less cost of goods sold) was \$1,284 better than budget while operating expenses of \$374,613 were \$71,685 below budget. Revenue for the month of February was \$10,295 above budget of \$556,697. Dining Room Food Sales and Golf Packages contributed to the Revenue overrun, while a health insurance refund contributed to the expense under run.

Department Spotlight

The Department for the month of February is the Country Club. This department encompasses the Dining Room, the 19th Hole, and banquets and catering. On board as Country Club Manager since late October, Eli Biggers has revamped the dining room menu, adding new items such as the Live Action stations on Thursday night, Friday night Grill and Martini specials, and Sunday Brunch Omelet Station.
