From the Desk of the President

FOR AUGUST 2023 hanks to everyone who voted in the June Members Meeting concerning the four propositions/changes to our Charter, By Laws etc. The final tally of all 4 propositions was approximately 950 for and 30 against.

County The Hancock Chamber of Commerce recently announced that the DH POA was named a finalist in the "Business of the Year in Diamondhead."

This competition involves Bay St Louis, Waveland, and the unincorporated areas in Hancock County. As far as I know, this is the first time our POA has been nominated in this competition.

The DH POA is actually one of the larger businesses in Hancock County with a vearly budget of around \$6 million and about 140 employees, 70 full time and 70 part-time.

In addition, the POA operates and manages amenities worth an estimated \$20-\$30 million. The winners will be announced in late August.

Since the last edition of the DH News, I was shown three articles on social media that I think were interesting:

The first article stated

that if the POA would "go away" property values in DH would increase. The Hancock County Assessor has stated in various public settings that is 100% incorrect.

I meet new residents each month and everyone says that the amenities played a significant role in their decision to buy in DH. It's also interesting that the local developers are requiring their new homes and condos to become members of the POA. I realize I've written the following before, but you need to drive to the St. Andrews area of Ocean Springs and see if you would like to move there, since they lost the one golf course amenity that they had after Katrina.

The second media post I was shown stated emphatically that property values had gone up in DH, but only in areas where the covenants may or may not have expired.

According to various realtors, that I've talked to, that is completely false.

It's also interesting that when most properties go up for sale in DH, part of the description mentions the various amenities that are available here. Why do you think that's included in the sales pitch?

The third media post was from a property owner who complained that the POA

received over \$1,000 during closing and he had no idea why that occurred. The owner of the property in question had to have over \$1,000 in back dues before his/her covenants may, or may not, have expired.

A significant amount of money from back dues is owed to the POA and the POA is required by its fiduciary responsibilities to use the legal process to obtain payments that owners are legally required to pay.

I did have one phone call worthy of note. The caller asked me why the POA was in the process of trying to get a final decision from the MS Supreme Court. The caller suggested that the POA should not pursue that route. Basically, the POA Board has the fiduciary responsibility to do what's best for the corporation. This means the Board must do whatever it can legally do to get a final, definitive answer.

Once a final, definitive decision is made by the MS Supreme Court, the POA will react accordingly.

Planning ahead: There will be another election in June 2024 for POA President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and three Directors. More info to come at a later date.

Golfers, with or without a handicap flag, must keep their carts a minimum of 30 yards away from greens/greens surrounds (bunkers, mounds, etc.) The handicap flag, for those that may still have one, does not allow players to drive off the cart path when we are cart path only or any closer than 30 yards of the greens/greens surrounds. Also, carts must return to the cart path side of the hole being played. Please do not go around the side of the green opposite the cart path. We appreciate everyone's cooperation.

On a course maintenance note, please make sure that you are keeping all four tires of your golf carts on the cart path around all greens and tees. A common tendency is to pull

Diamondhead Aviator -- Incidental Learning

In the movie, The Matrix, Neo and his friends could learn just by having a program loaded through a computer port in their skulls. As great as that would be, we still have to do the hard work of manually inserting data into our organic memory banks.

I'm active in some online pilot mentor and general aviation groups and I enjoy seeing new pilots starting that exciting climb up the experience ladder. As they're studying for certificates or ratings, they'll occasionally ask questions. Quite often, I'll be considered mean for responding to those online questions with an FAR, AIM or Pilot's Handbook of Aeronautical Knowledge (or similar) reference. In our modern day world of helicopter parenting, many people consider it mean to tell someone to do their own research. But we're not helping them by just handing them the answers. In trying to make things easier, we may

actually handicap them and this will show when those students face an examiner for a certificate or rating test.

Incidental learning is defined as learning that is unplanned or unintended. It's the unintended byproduct of activities like reading, taking a class or even watching someone doing something technical. While doing research, we will usually gain more insight into the 'big picture' because we discover interesting connections to other information.

Sure, it's easy to ask, "How do I do that?". But doing the research allows us to fully understand the material. What if you're trying to learn about what makes an airplane turn? Going online and asking random people for the answer will give you a few informed responses buried in a mass of wildly creative but wrong answers. But in the end, if you DO get the correct information, you've got the data but not the full understanding behind that data.

Now you have the correct answer, horizontal component of lift, and you go to your check ride with that canned answer. Then the examiner asks follow-up questions? What about load factor? What exactly IS the horizontal component of lift? How does that affect the vertical component of lift?

Asking directions to a store, you'll get directions to that store. No insights into alternative shopping locations, advice on avoiding traffic dangers along the way, or in-depth discussions about shopping methods.

When a student digs into

the books to learn about what makes an airplane turn, they start reading about lift produced by the wing, vector mathematics, load factor, angle of attack, critical angle of attack, the V-G diagram and more. And when the check ride comes, they'll be able to confidently answer the question and any follow-up questions because they will have truly learned the material.

As the saying goes, nothing worthwhile is easy. Before asking Google or online groups for the answer, spend some time in the books. You'll be surprised how much you can learn. When check ride time comes, you'll be able to dazzle that examiner with not just the correct answer but a more complete understanding of the how and the why.

Best of luck on all of your educational endeavors and I'll look for you on the flight line.
