# **\*\*** FROM THE DESK OF THE PRESIDENT

#### BY ERNIE KNOBLOCH President's Report FOR NOVEMBER 2023

The Thanksgiving lunch buffet at the Club is well attended every year. Information on this event is available in the Club. on the POA Facebook page, and eblasts (if you have signed up for this with the POA). Be sure to be on the lookout for more details. Make your reservations early because, based on previous years, there may not be any space left if you wait too long. If you reserve a spot and then your plans change, be sure to notify the Club as early as possible. In the past, we have had some groups simply not show up, which results in extra food expenses and empty tables that could have been used by someone else.

DH has the largest women's golf participation of any golf club of which I'm aware. We have the

DWGA (Diamondhead Women's Golf Association-play 18 holes on Thursday morning) and the DWGAN (Diamondhead Women's Golf Association Nines-play 9 holes on Tuesday morning). In addition, there's a significant number of wom-

en players who play on their own or in unofficial groups. A significant number of these golfers, also, play in many of the golf tournaments here, including many charity tournaments. If you're a woman who has never tried golf. check with the Pro Shop to see how they can help you try golf for the first time. I know of several women golfers who moved from DH to other golfing areas and then returned to DH because of the lack of women golfers in that area.

A recent study found that golfers actually live longer than non-golfers. The suggested reason for this is that golfers can continue playing as they get older (I'm not going to attempt to define "older") which means they're getting exercise outside and having social interactions with various groups of people. Exercise and social interactions are important to aging well. In DH, we have at least ten active male golfers who are over 90 vears old (oldest I'm aware of will be 97 in December 2023) and at least three 90+ years old women golfers.

The Slavic Golf Tournament was recently held in DH over a Friday- Sunday weekend. Over 600 participants played, and DH golf was included in various ads and TV reports. The free publicity for DH is very beneficial to our community. Every Slavic golfer that I talked with said they were impressed by the courses and the organization of the entire event. I realize that some local golfers are not happy with both DH courses being closed for three consecutive days. The POA, after all expenses were paid, had a net profit from the tournament which showed a significant increase in income over a normal Fridav – Sundav time period. Income from tournaments helps offset golf course expenses. For many, this benefit outweighs the three-day closure.

There are approximately 350 individual golf memberships and 65 family golf memberships. This group paid a total of approximately \$1.27 million dollars in fees to play golf. So far in 2023, total golf income from golfers, tournaments, and individual guests covers ALL GOLF EXPENSES INCLUDING GOLF COURSE MAIN-TENANCE.

Some people have asked what dues are used for. As of August 31, 2023, dues in 2023 are used to supplement income as follows. Clubhouse \$41,532, Community Center \$59,943, Tennis \$25,273, Golf Shop \$0, Golf Course Maintenance \$0 (Golf course income pays for Pro Shop operations and golf course maintenance), Golf Academy \$41,374, Grounds Maintenance \$224,662, Facilities Main-

tenance \$240,464, Marketing \$112,456 Southside Restaurant \$4,881, Airport \$3,027, Marina \$21,082, Recreation \$189,287, Administration \$304,279 (this includes salaries, facilities insur-




