From the Desk of the President

FOR SEPTEMBER 2023

Hancock County The Chamber of Commerce named the Club at Diamondhead as the Diamondhead Business of the Year for 2023. This is the first time that I can remember this award being received by us. All the employees of the POA, plus the all-volunteer Board, are congratulated for the work done to receive this honor which was presented to the Club at Diamondhead during the annual Hancock Business, Industry and Awards Gala held in the Hollywood Casino. Similar awards were given out to businesses in Bay St. Louis, Waveland, Kiln, and the county. Individuals in the various areas were also recognized. There were several hundred attendees at this event.

The federal government offered an Employment Retention Tax Credit (ERTC) to specific types of organizations that retained their employees during COVID shutdowns. The POA was able to keep the employees it normally had working during those

times, so we applied for a reimbursement grant in May 2022. The POA received a total of \$323,000 for Quarters 2 and 3 in the ERTC timeline and a total of \$431,000 for Quarters 1 and 4. We received a net total of \$764,000 after the company handling this process for us was paid. This one-time money will be used to pay for capital expenses that must be done to improve some of our aging infrastructure. A special "THANKS" to everyone involved with this process.

We have two pump stations that supply water on the golf courses and other areas. The pump station on the Pine is in relatively good shape due to maintenance that's been done over the last 35 + years. The Pine Pump Station can supply water to the Cardinal course on a limited basis, but the Cardinal pump cannot be used to water the Pine. Eventually, this pump and well will have to be replaced at an estimated cost of about \$120,000. A new main pump, the down shaft and down hole pump, a new control panel, the well casing, etc. need to be replaced entirely, since these parts are estimated to be 40-50 years old and replacement parts are no longer available. This is obviously a lot of money, but if you envision mostly dead grass behind over 600 homes and 200 condos, plus the loss of income from golf fees, we really don't have any choice but to refurbish these areas. We are also required to do this as part of the Board's fiduciary responsibility to maintain the amenities. This capital expense is an example of a capital project that can be paid for with ERTC funds.

How much grass does the POA cut? When you add up two golf courses, as well as the distance from a green to the next tee, the driving range, land adjacent to the air strip, land near the marina, four pools, recreation areas, Twin Lakes, the old stables and other areas, the estimate is that the POA cuts and maintains a minimum of seven (7) million square feet of grass. How much grass do you cut at your house?

Vandalism at Twin Lakes (restrooms), on the Cardinal course (greens + restroom) has cost us about \$20,000 in the last two months. If we can determine, with your help.

who did the vandalism, the POA will seek damages in a court of law.

It's my understanding that Elliott Homes has decided NOT to construct a road from Golf Club Drive all the way back to their development inside the Cardinal course.

A resident contacted me

and said he read on local social media that the POA did not have a "Hurricane Plan." The reality is that the POA has a detailed twenty-nine-page plan that's updated every year.

Be sure to stay cool and hydrated as the dog days of summer continue.

Adult Crafts and Conversation takes over the meeting room at 12:30 on Fridays. Expertise and materials


