FROM THE DESK OF THE PRESIDENT

BOARD PRESIDENT

Thank you to all who voted in the Annual Member meeting on August 2. We have welcomed a new Director to the Board. Dr. Arlen "Ken" Griffey was elected to replace the term of Stuart Stromeyer. We are glad to have him ioin in the challenges that are unfolding and know his perspective will aid the Board in doing its best. Welcome, Ken! To update actions from last month - 1.) Airport discussions continue. The more we talk, the more we realize the complexity of the issues involved. 2.) On August 5, 2025, the City Council provided a Resolution regarding their interest in many of the green spaces (including the Community Center building) that we had shared in the Vision for the Future of the POA. The Board is now reviewing the City's Resolution and will ensure we do the right thing for the membership within our fiduciary responsibility. 3.) The Board has continued to look at the property tax implications of each amenity. More work is in progress including plans to evaluate the impact of property taxes on the 2026 budget. 4.) Analysis of the data from the survey has begun. A big THANK YOU to those who shared their opinions!

The newly established committee to explore, improve and clarify the bylaws and membership has begun its work and will present a proposal at the August meeting. We have begun to examine what the options are for the POA organization of the future. In order to continue our work efficiently, another committee was formed to study the details of divesting the POA of amenities. That committee's charter is proposed for Board approval at the August meeting. We are using these committees to enhance the process of decision-making by the full Board. A Board of 11 people has a very hard time finalizing discussions, just like any committee of over 10 people has a hard time making decisions. These committees are tasked to do the legwork needed for decision making to ultimately ensure the Board has solid information-backed recommendations to consider. The Board is guided by its fiduciary responsibility to properly manage the goals and assets of the POA. We must make the best, most logical decisions for the membership and the organization that we serve.

The Board realizes this seems like a slow and tedious

process and we all wish these changes would not take forever, but our desire is to do the right thing the first time

resulting in the best possible outcome for all.

I, and all the members of the Board, thank you for the opportunity to serve the Diamondhead Property Owners Association and its great amenities.

RECURRING EDUCATION AND AVIATION SEMINARS

I love attending aviation seminars. There's always something to learn and I enjoy connecting with others in our aviation community. Many years ago, a presenter made a very profound statement about seminar attendance. He said, 'The problem with seminars is those who really need to improve their flying, never attend them.'

Flight Training magazine's slogan is, 'A good pilot is always learning', and it's so true. Aviation requires us to be lifelong learners. Professional pilots, doctors, lawyers and many other professions require continuing education. For the average non-instrument rated General Avi-

ation pilot, the only required currency is a flight review every twenty-four months and three landings every ninety days. But are you a safe pilot by doing the bare minimum?

The seminar I attended earlier this week brought air traffic controllers in to explain some of the ways pilots get into trouble and methods for not only flying safer but keeping your friendly FAA inspector from having a chat with you. It had so much good information, I decided to use this month's article to pass on some of the important points.

R-4403 Headaches

Those of us who've been flying around this area for a few decades remember when R-4403 was a small rectangle

of restricted airspace covering the Stennis Space Center from the surface to five thousand feet. Unfortunately, restricted airspace tends to grow faster than kids, and in 2016, R-4403 grew from that small rectangle to a giant that runs almost to the Picavune Airport, labeled R-4403 A,B,C,E and F and may go up to 12,000 MSL. The good news is that those new airspace areas are rarely active. But how do we know if the airspace is active or not? The Stennis tower manager, David Kaupp explained that when those areas go active (or hot in controller/military terms), they say so via the ATIS. A quick listen on 118.375 will let you know if you can transition the area.

Of course, Gulfport Approach will also know the status.

Don't Be a Stranger (or who knows what a TRSA is??)

Anyone remember TCA's, ARSA's and PCA? When airspace classifications became the A, B, C's, the Terminal Radar Service Area (TRSA) got left behind as there was no ICAO equivalent. Most TRSA's were turned into class C airspace (the old ARSA), but a handful remain, including Gulfport. While class B, C and





D airspace have communications requirements for entering those areas, TRSA's are strictly voluntary until you get to what is basically a class D around the airport. It is completely legal to fly at thirty-five hundred feet or higher across the entire Mississippi Gulf Coast without speaking to a soul. But is it smart? Is it safe? Consider how much traffic passes through that airspace daily. Gulfport Approach would love to hear from you, give you a transponder code and keep you informed of other aircraft in your area. Just call them up and let

them help you make your flight that much safer.

I've Got a Number for You to Call When You Land

Nobody wants to hear a controller give you a number to call for a 'possible pilot deviation'. The guest controllers explained a few of the most common offenses and ways to avoid them.

Runway Incursions—when taxiing around large airports, make sure you have a taxi chart in view at all times. When given a taxi clearance, jot it down and read it back completely. Before you call up for your taxi clearance, listen to the ATIS if there is one. Know which runway you're likely to be assigned and view the most

likely route there so the taxi clearance won't be too much of a surprise. And pay attention to runway incursion hot spots, where pilots are more likely to accidentally wander onto an active runway.

Altitude errors—The primary traffic separation method controllers use is altitude separation and being as little as one thousand feet off an assigned altitude can place you in dangerous proximity to other aircraft. There are a few ways to avoid altitude errors. Newer avionics have altitude preselects to allow autopilots to hold an assigned altitude. But for those of us without those fancy new gadgets, use some method like an altitude bug, Like this one by Sporty's

https://www.sportys.com/altitude-alert-indicator-2-3-4-in-dia.html, or just write it down on your notepad.

TFR's—Temporary Flight Restrictions have become a huge risk for pilots as they can pop up anywhere with very little notice. This is another good reason to use flight following, so ATC can point out any TFR's along your route. Apps like Foreflight will display them on the map, so it's a good idea to check out your route before and during the flight.


Even though our hot/ humid conditions continue, many of our gals are determined to get out on the course as often as they possibly can.

and Nancy Sislow all posting only 16 putts. In Flight 3 - it was Pattie Blackwood with 18 putts.



LONG-TIME EMPLOYEE BUYS HISTORIC NEWSPAPER

For the first time in more than 50 years, the Sea Coast Echo is once again locally owned — Echo Publisher Geoff Belcher and his wife Sandra purchased the newspaper, closing the deal last Thursday, Aug. 7.

"We did it the old-fashioned way," Geoff Belcher said. "By going into an enormous amount of debt."

The Belchers purchased the business from Bay St. Louis Newspapers, Inc., which is managed by Alabama-based Lancaster Management, Inc., which bought the

paper in 1968.

Sandra has worked for the Hancock County branch of the District Attorney's office since October 1999. She plans to continue her service there for the foreseeable future, she said.

"Local journalism sheds light on our community in various ways, publishing the life events of the citizens such as important meetings, high school graduation, wedding announcements and obituaries to name a few," Sandra said. "It also focuses on social justice issues and informs the community about crimes and safety issues. Our family is

honored to serve the citizens of Hancock County in this capacity. It is an honor and we are humbled to be a part of the rich heritage of the Sea Coast Echo.

The couple lives in Bay St. Louis with their 16-year-old daughter, Sarah.

The Belchers moved to Bay St. Louis in 1999. At the time, Geoff was working for another Lancaster-managed paper, the Appalachian News-Express.

"We started sharing copies of the papers, and I decided we needed to live in a community where there's a tide schedule on the front page every week," Geoff newspaper published losaid. cally, they went back to

Just a few years after the family moved to the Bay — and just a year after they bought their first house here —Hurricane Katrina nearly wiped out the Gulf Coast, and nearly demolished the Echo offices on Court Street.

With no way to get the

newspaper published locally, they went back to Kentucky, and worked with the Appalachian News-Express to put together a special "Hurricane Katrina" edition of the Echo and ship it back down so the readers wouldn't miss a week of their paper.

"I fell in love with this

community and this newspaper nearly three decades ago," Geoff said, "and I'm honored to be able to be the Echo's caretaker today. I'm immensely grateful to the people of this commu-

nity and all our customers and readers who keep us going."

The Sea Coast Echo was founded in 1892. The first issue of the weekly Echo came out on January 9, 1892, with the motto "Fearless in all

Things." Its goal was to be an "all home print" newspaper and promised "a first class newsy local paper" to the people of Bay St. Louis, Hancock County, and the Coast.


The issue announced 18-yearold Charles G. Moreau, "a young man of great newspaper ability," as the editor. Except for a six-year stretch from 1912 to 1917, when the Echo was expanded to eight pages, Moreau produced a four-page newspaper until at least 1922. In addition to being the sole owner for most of his 50 years with the Echo, Moreau also owned stores and residences and was an officer in the Merchant Bank of Bay St. Louis.

The Echo has evolved with

the times while remaining deeply committed to community journalism. Covering everything from city council meetings and high school sports to storm recovery and cultural events, the SeaCoast Echo continues to be a vital part of life in Hancock County. With both print and digital offerings, the Echo stays focused


on informing, connecting, and reflecting the coastal communities it serves.

"Like we put on the front page after Hurricane Katrina," Geoff said, "'We're still here,' and our mission to inform and celebrate the community will continue"






