FROM THE DESK OF THE PRESIDENT

At the September open Board meeting, the motion to offer selected amenities for sale was not supported. That led to a Special Meeting held September 29th during which it was decided to seek membership input into the transfer of the amenities to the City.

That non-binding survey was completed on October 15th in time to be used at the October meeting to guide the next step in divesting the POA of properties it can no longer support. As you may recall the Board has a mandate from the initial Takeover Agreement to maintain the amenities as they were given to the property owners

. That is very difficult to do with limited funds. Since the Purcell group has the right of first refusal for any sale we consider, and there are many legal details to be determined if transfer is approved, legal counsel will be needed to assure the correct steps are taken.

Action on the transfer of amenities and use of legal counsel will take place at the October Board meeting. The plan is for video and audio to be available through the Diamondhead POA website should you wish to follow the proceedings to see what will happen next.

After the September open Board meeting, an Executive

session was held to discuss the organization's financial status.

At that time, the Board approved raising the dues to keep the organization solvent while the future of the organization is developed. The dues increase was announced early in hopes that we would better determine the financial landscape for 2026. As of this writing, there have been dedicated members who have paid their dues early.

There have also been concerns expressed about the increase, but the mandate to maintain what amenities we have and the continued reduction of property owners whose covenants expired who no longer pay dues, have led us to this decision. The remainder of the budget will be approved soon, but this will help us plan the most balanced budget we can in these tough times. We are also facing increasing costs to provide service and pay insurances, just as you all are. We will find a way through

There are many challenges to meet to develop fully what 2026 will look like. Your Board of Directors is working the best they can to face these challenges. In the end, we all want our wonderful Diamondhead to remain.

Thank you for the opportunity to serve the Diamondhead Property Owners Association and its great amenities.







From Shamble to Stableford, the stories of September were filled with great swings, close finishes, and moments that reminded everyone why they love the game.






