

## FROM THE DESK OF THE PRESIDENT

Through April and May the Board held weekly meetings to continue our work on a plan to manage the amenities for the future with a goal to hopefully reduce or eliminate dues.

The amended Resolution from which we are working listed four options for management of the amenities; 1. Continue ownership and operation of some or all of the amenities by the DHPOA, 2. Market and sell all the amenities to a single purchaser, 3. Market and separately sell some or all of the amenities to multiple purchasers, and 4. Donate the amenities to the City of Diamondhead.

Based on the financial problems resulting from reduced income from dues and no feedback received from the company that evaluates golf courses and related amenities for potential sale (see option #2), Because the Board wants to try to have a plan, for the future Board to manage, in place by the end of the year, we have proceeded with option #3 to market and separately sell some or all of the amenities to multiple purchasers. As a result, there may soon be new owners of the Marina and Camphouse restaurant and the RV stor-

age. A contract for the sale of Tennis is being finalized.

The offers for purchase of the Marina and restaurant and the RV storage were provided to the Purcell Corporation representatives as they have the right of first refusal. They had 15 days to review the offers and determine if they wish to match the offers and make the purchase themselves. Purcell Corporation waived its right to match the offer on the RV storage property, and the potential new owner has begun its due diligence. The deadline for the Purcell Corporation to match the offer on the Marina and restaurant has expired as of this writing, and the potential new owner has begun its due diligence. If the Board and the party interested in the

purchase of Tennis agree to a contract, it will be presented to Purcell Corporation to consider its right of first refusal, and it will have to decide whether to match the purchase price by early June.

As mentioned, based on reviewing option #2, to market and sell all the amenities to a single purchaser, the Board is awaiting an evaluation of the golf courses, Club and pools from an outside firm experienced in helping golf courses find the best owner.

While awaiting that information, the Board has decided to proceed with determining the financial viability of implementing option #1 which is to continue the DHPOA's ownership and operation of some or all of the amenities. We have tasked the GM and business consultant with providing options for the Board to consider. All our considerations continue to be based on the goal of preserving Diamondhead's wonderful recreational nature.

The GM and staff have begun to collect information about the trial pool memberships offered to those citizens who are not paying POA dues this year. The response has increased as the weather has gotten warmer but is still low. There are also some people who have chosen to pay their annual dues recently. We will continue to gather data reflecting interest in the pool pass option through late summer to include it with the option to manage the amenities ourselves.

We have had brief discussions regarding the date of the annual meeting but want to ensure we have something concrete to hand over to a new Board before we finalize a date. We need to ensure we follow the Bylaws requirements before an exact date

is set.

Determining a solid plan for the future of the amenities continues to challenge this Board. We continue to be open to all the suggestions, concerns and thoughts that so many of you are willing to share. Thank you for taking the time to tell us your

thoughts and keep them coming! Please be assured we are seeking to maintain Diamondhead as the recreational, green-space gem that it is. The Board of Directors and I thank you for the opportunity to serve the members of the POA and this community.

She used her time to instruct members on summer plantings and shared strategies for continuous blooming, efficient watering and pest management to keep our gardens vibrant during sultry summer months.

Diamondhead Garden Club is currently on summer hiatus for the months of June, July and August. This allows club members to take a break from formal club meetings, shift attention to their gardens and enjoy all of the blooms.

June is here. In the garden, it is time to plant warm-season grasses including, Bermuda, centipede, zoysia, and St. Augustine (June to August). Summer annuals of ageratum, cockscomb, impatiens, marigolds and periwinkle are ready for the ground. Gladiolus planted at this time will give lovely fall blooms. Fertilize all ornamental shrubs/trees and annuals/perennials with a slow-release fertilizer. If you missed spring feeding, June is a good month to fertilize your camellias. Scout your landscape and garden regularly for pests and treat as needed. Prune oleanders after blooming ends. Pinch dahlias and mums to ensure a compact growth habit. Remove faded flowers from daisies, daylilies and other summer flowers.
